When we are hurt by someone, we may need time to take stock of our feelings, but ultimately it is most helpful to take a position of humility. A position that refuses to judge, refuses to adopt a self righteous attitude, and refuses to hold a grudge. A grudge is like toxic waste: it only hurts the person who holds it. So how many times should we forgive the person who wrongs us? When Jesus says seventy –seven times, he really means stop counting. Forgive as many times as it takes.

Today's parable of the unmerciful servant illustrates a story of somebody who refuses to forgive. The servant represents us, the Master can be seen as God, a God who forgives and is willing to keep on forgiving. But if we refuse to forgive that may be a sin that may require forgiveness through the sacrament of reconciliation. The moral of the Gospel parable centres on the need of the community to act with God like compassion towards all. "

Face coverings will be mandatory in Places of Worship from Saturday 8th August2020. All Those who are attending church must wear a face covering unless they are exempt from doing so.
