It is a number of years since we celebrated the Second Sunday after the Nativity as the feast of the epiphany was moved to this Sunday, but now it is back to its usual date and occurs this Wednesday. This weekend we have a chance to hear again or for the first time this year the words of the Prologue in the gospel of St. John. Although we have just finished the celebration of Christmas there is nothing about the child in the manger. Instead we hear about the cosmic significance of the birth and the astounding truth that God walked on earth among us. Trying to describe how Jesus is fully divine and fully human is difficult, so John paints a picture without using the image of the Baby Jesus. Jesus was God before the world began, and is now finally revealed to us.

This may be the first Mass that many of us will attend at the beginning of this New Year. We have all been battered by the past year, we all need the assurance that God is with us in the good and bad. If God is truly made flesh and lived among us, he knows our suffering and joys.

As we approach the end of Christmastide we might take the time to reflect on the past few weeks, and what we did at Christmas. In the thoughts of St. John it is about God reaching out to us. Through Jesus we build an intimate relationship of trust in God, which is something for us all to think about this New year, especially our relationship towards each other and the witness and behaviour we present. We ask for God's blessing on all this Sunday for the coming year.
